Teamwork Makes the Dream Work

Back in March, while my family was visiting Calvary and Grants
Pass for the first time, I offered a vision of leadership based
especially on Exodus 17:11-13 – Moses (literally) being supported

by his fellow leaders. Traditional models of leadership usually look like a triangle with one person at the top. Another model puts a single person at the bottom of an upside-down triangle, trying to bear the weight of the whole community.

I'm not strong enough for either of those, and so I've proposed something else: mutuality. Mutuality means we never try to act alone or on our own, but rather seek out others to work together, share burdens, and support one another as partners in ministry. Even when a particular ministry belongs especially to one person, they seek out ways to involve others.

I've had the privilege in my travels of getting to know all sorts of interesting people, especially in the "Lutheran world." One such person was the synod's head of youth ministry in Philadelphia when Sister Jennie and I were both serving as youth directors in that area. Some years later, this woman had become the Director of the ELCA Youth Gathering — an indescribably massive undertaking, hosting 30,000 young people for a week-long event of worship, music, service, learning and more, held every three years in a different city around the country.

At the 2018 Houston Gathering I ran into her, just as my group and dozens of other youth groups were lining up to board buses for day-long service projects. After a hello and a hug, I said to her, "No offense, but you look pretty relaxed for being the person supposedly in charge of all this," and she replied absolutely, one hundred percent earnestly, "I'm surrounded by a really good team."

If I ever look relaxed with my family in tow, it's because Sister Jennie and I make a pretty good team. If I ever look relaxed around Calvary or out in the community serving in God's name, it's because I'm surrounded by a really good team here – one that's only getting better at what we do together, as we get to know each other better.

With the Holy Spirit at our back and with the support of one another, there is literally nothing we cannot do together to serve others, locally and globally, in response to the unconditional love God has already shown us. As we dream about who God is calling us to be as Calvary Lutheran Church, let us also pray that God will pull us together into small teams, bigger teams, and one big team for the sake of the Good News of Jesus Christ.

The Deaconess Assembly: Unplugging

For two-and-a-half days, sisters of the ELCA Deaconess Community assembled in Minneapolis. We ate together, we worshiped together, we wrestled with our identity as a community of women in a rapidly changing world, and we also had much-needed time to play and have fellowship time together.

The theme of the weekend was Unplugging. We were invited—challenged, even—to be in relationship with each other without the help of our tablets, phones, and computers, as



much as we could stand, to put the technology and noise aside and just be together.

If you struggle to "unplug," I am with you in the challenge. It was refreshing for me because I'll be the first to admit how easy it is to get lost in the noise of technology. So I come back to you with a fresh soul, excited to continue getting to know each of you!

I always like to bring home ministry resources or learnings from my time away at Assemblies as I come back to my own congregation. Most relevant to our area, I have learned that a deaconess sister in Seattle has been invited into an effort to help Lutheran Disaster Response create an emotional-spiritual care program for communities impacted by disasters in the Pacific Northwest and elsewhere.

This is being organized as a partnership with the Oregon Synod, and others, as wildfires become more and more a part of our landscape. They are working to help disaster-impacted communities become more resilient after an immediate crisis has been addressed. Another focus is helping communities most likely to be impacted by wildfires be more prepared for future events. I am just beginning to learn about this, but I will share more as I learn it. I believe there will be ways for pastors, deacons, and congregations, such as Calvary, to be invited into this work.

Healthy Communication

Transitions are naturally a time of heightened anxiety. Since we have several ongoing transitions at Calvary, it's a very good time to lay out what healthy communication looks like.

Direct communication is the key. Anonymous communication through third parties often feels easier, but unless your only goal is to "vent" (and we all need to vent sometimes!) it rarely improves a situation for someone to pass along anonymous feedback.

Anonymous feedback can't be followed up on for clarification or further details. So if it's negative, the recipient hears the general concern loud and clear, but then is often unable to address the concern constructively and is, instead, left guessing at what's really wrong.

Anonymous feedback is often shared as "some people are saying..." However, healthy communication means speaking for yourself. Ideally, this is direct, in private, and at least initially one-on-one. Matthew 18:15-17 lays this out very clearly.

Most of the time it should be relatively easy to practice direct communication. Honestly, if something is important enough to share, it could benefit from follow-up and future clarification.

I realize it can be intimidating to approach a pastor directly. You've each had various experiences with other pastors, both positive and negative. This is one of many reasons that I am not your sole leader, but rather share leadership both formally and informally with a variety of people – including first and foremost, your congregation Council. These folks have been elected from Calvary's membership to oversee our life together and are entrusted with guiding us in mission and ministry in all its aspects.

So if you cannot attach your name to feedback, or speak directly to the person who needs to act on your feedback, please speak to a member of Calvary's Council you trust. Ask them for confidentiality, but please be open to them returning to you for clarification and further insight. No one can address what they do not fully understand.
