Scouts at Calvary

This past Sunday, with Calvary's council's approval, president Matt Eide and I signed paperwork to pave the way for this congregation to sponsor a brand new scout troop that will be forming in February. Like all scout troops, it will be an explicitly religious but nonsectarian group. All girls between the ages of 11 and 18 will be welcome in this new troop, tentatively numbered Troop 8229.

This builds on the excitement around here when we hosted local Troop 22 (my son's troop) and Pack 3029 (my daughters' Cub Scout Pack) for Scout Sunday last February. As my oldest daughter prepares to transition out of Cub Scouts with two other girls, we faced the dilemma that the closest appropriate troop for them meets in Jacksonville.

Now here's the potentially confusing part. These girls do NOT plan to become Girl Scouts, nor will we be affiliating with Girl Scouts of America (GSA). They have a great program! And they're famous for their cookie sales! We've hosted groups of Girl Scouts before, most recently for the Angstadts. But that is not what we're signing these girls up for.

Instead, we're starting a troop affiliated with Scouting America, known until very recently as Boy Scouts of America (BSA). Indeed the latter is still their formal identity, as they are congressionally chartered, and "Scouting America" is now their "doing business as" identity.

This is the natural next step for these girls. Girls have been welcomed into Cub Scouts since 2018, and my older two are each starting their fourth year this fall. The last year of Cub Scouts, the "Arrow of Light" (AoL) program is designed to "bridge" them into a troop in late winter/early spring.

My son bridged to Troop 22 shortly after we arrived in Grants Pass. We're now creating a pathway for Allie and her friends to do the same. The mission of Scouting America is the same for both boys and girls, Cubs and troop-level Scouts. As the Scout Oath, which they all recite at the beginning of every scout meeting says:

"On my honor I will do my best to do my duty to God and my country and to obey the Scout Law; to help other people at all times; to keep myself physically strong, mentally awake, and morally straight."

And the Scout Law further elaborates: "A scout is trustworthy, loyal, helpful, friendly, courteous, kind, obedient, cheerful, thrifty, brave, clean and reverent."

Please come talk to Sister Jennie if you're even mildly curious. Our work will need to start soon so come find me. And very soon we will be asking the congregation how they might be called to share their gifts on a smaller sub-team, but we'll get there.

Littles 0-3 are free


We'll gather after the tour for a fall snack at the park pavilion to talk about the experience.

The Christmas Story Told from the Perspective of the Stable Animals"




Sunday, December 14 during worship

Talking About Loss

"Life sometimes seems like nothing more than a series of losses, from beginning to end. That's the given. How you respond to those losses ... that's the part you have to make up as you go."

—The Music Lesson by Katharine Weber

I know nothing of Katharine Weber other than this novel features a painting by Vermeer. However, there is much wisdom in this quote. We experience loss and the accompanying emotions of grief throughout life: deaths of people we love, loss of relationships, loss of jobs, friendships, marriages, pets, and health.

I have held several grief groups at Calvary which I believe have been valuable to those who have been members. I'm interested in trying something new this year. I would like to invite you to sessions held in the sanctuary at 11:00 AM on Fridays prior to "Lunch With Friends" starting in October. I will have a brief presentation and then invite you to make groups of 3 or 4. I will have some prepared questions for the group; however, the primary goal is to invite you to talk about your experience of loss and then provide the opportunity for you to listen and support others. The conversations may continue at the "Lunch With Friends" (just remember to sign up.)

The presentations will be structured around Elizabeth Kubler Ross' 5 Stages of Grief.
