Transitions, Continued

As I shared in July, we are in a season of transitions. Diana Little is stepping up to replace financial accountant Janine Nave. We celebrated Wendy Ross' retirement at the end of August. And we have hired Carolyn Grossi to take over from Kim White as our administrative assistant.

Carolyn is a longtime member of St. Anne Catholic here in GP, and like many of you, grew up in California, but she's been here longer than nearly all of us. She is already proving adept and adaptable, and as soon as we get her email access straightened out, the office will be firing on all cylinders again.

Her hours will generally be 9am-3pm Monday through Friday, with a flexible half hour off for lunch. On certain days she'll arrive and leave early (e.g. when we host the Red Cross blood drives). The interview team was particularly impressed with her solid understanding of the crucial importance of both direct communication and protecting confidentiality.

Our worship and music committee has elected not to directly replace Wendy as music director. Pianist Jeannine Reddell will be picking up music selection duties, with guidance from me and Jackie Matheny. The Praise Team and the Sound of Praise quartet will be self-directing. Choir and handbells are currently on hiatus.

Diana Little is taking over the nuts and bolts of Calvary's finances with continued guidance from Janine Nave, her predecessor Gary Blom, and treasurer Noel Hoback.

Our financial accountant is a hired staff position with voice and vote on our congregation council, and is responsible for paying bills, including payroll, and generating reports. This person also physically makes deposits, although those are prepared by a separate team, currently Crystal Zimmer, April Marshall and Kim Grinde.

Diana's primary paid vocation for three decades was in financial roles for the U.S. Air Force, and she also served five years as office administrator at Faith Lutheran in Roseburg. We have great confidence in her, and she expressed great enthusiasm for this role. That's needed—because it's a lot of very detail-oriented work! We are grateful for her willingness.

Other new members who joined at the same time have also been contributing in their own ways—helping us refresh our audiovisual systems, joining our outreach committee, and one of the Baker boys has expressed a strong interest in joining the praise team on guitar. We have two more families joining imminently. Who knows what the Spirit will inspire them to step into? Please take a moment to welcome Carolyn when you get a chance, and also to get to know our newest members, the Willhites and the Bagoses!

Starting the Year Out Right

After my kids got home from school on the first day of school, I decided to try something different with them, a new tradition. Instead of asking them the obligatory "how was your day? What did you do?" questions, I decided to ask them a set of different questions. "Tell me something that you learned today (about yourself, your teacher, a classmate, a learning concept). And also where did you see God today? It created more of a conversation and made them think. They could no longer just pass the questions and say "Fine...Nothing!"

And that made me think about everyone at Calvary. These are questions that could be part of a new spiritual discipline for your own family or in your own life. Because we should always keep learning whether its about ourselves, those around us, or our community that we live in. And to always be wondering and noticing where and when you feel God's presence. Sometimes its more obvious where we feel his presence, other times its more subtle. The more you are watching and asking yourself the more you can train yourself to be watchful.

It reminds me one of my favorite Old Testament stories that often gets overlooked involving one of the major prophets, Elijah, looking for God to appear on the mountain as directed by God. He was looking for God in the large obvious forces of nature, when God actually appears to him in the sheer sound of silence. God is there in our lives but sometimes not where with think to look. This story comes from 1 Kings 19.

I encourage you to wonder about these two areas this next month. Ask those in your family or close friends as you talk with them what they have learned today, and where they saw God today, and see where the conversation goes.

September Faithful Hikers


Our next hike takes place on **Saturday, September 6 at 9:00 am.** We'll be meeting at Briggs Creek Trail in Merlin.
