



Leading with Curiosity

Last week I had the privilege of spending several days at a retreat with all my fellow pastors and deacons. There was a lot of sitting in silence—most of you know how hard that is for me—and just when I would get comfortable being alone with my thoughts: "Okay, turn to one or two people to share!"

The conversations that came out of that were rich and fruitful. In the middle of one such conversation, a colleague said: "I think Paul left at least one important 'fruit of the spirit' off his list: curiosity." And I told him, wow, yes, that sounds exactly right!

What would it look like for each of us to lead with curiosity? I don't just mean how our leaders at Calvary lead. I mean leading all our conversations with curiosity, perhaps starting with "Tell me a little more about yourself!"

And when something surprises you, offering a nonjudgmental, "Oh, that's interesting, why is that?" Or when it seems like an emotion is brewing under the surface, "How are you feeling about that?" And sometimes just following your natural curiosity, "Could you tell me more about that?" It almost always feels good to be asked such questions! Especially when it's clear that the asker is genuinely interested in your answers.

The secret beauty of such curiosity is that most of us really do want to talk about ourselves—not everything all at once, and certainly not the hard stuff, not with someone we're not yet sure we trust. And yet one key way to build trust is to enter into conversations with a posture of curiosity.

It's amazing what you can learn this way, even about people you've known for a very long time. And can you imagine how different this election season would be going if instead of shouting, mudslinging, fearmongering and misinformation, candidates for public office went into Election Day fostering a spirit of curiosity?

Okay, maybe that's too big a miracle to imagine! But consider curiosity's place among the more familiar fruits of the spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control (Galatians 5:22). We can ask God to bring forth all these fruits in our lives, for the sake of building stronger and deeper relationships with one another and those around us in our daily lives.

# FROM THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT, MATT EIDE

Dear Calvary Friends,

### The Annual Meeting will be Sunday, November 24 following the service.

We have talked a lot this year about giving and budget. Our expenses continue to run much higher than our giving. A particularly important note is that giving is the same/similar as 2022 and 2023.

	Giving	<u>Budget</u>
2022	\$348,809	\$348,809
2023	\$343,372	\$343,372
2024	\$345,000 (estimated)	\$420,159 (estimated)
2025	\$TBD	\$350,000 (pending)

Our challenge is that we collectively agreed (via vote) to increase our budget for 2024 to \$420,000. This puts the difference between budget and giving at approximately 75,000. There have been funds that have not been (or will not be) spent, with the estimate at \$400,000, or \$50,000 in money spent beyond what we have received.

When we agreed to the budget in December 2023, and it <u>was said</u> that the budget was aspirational. Unfortunately, giving stayed steady over the last (now) three years.

The Council will make recommendations on cuts (benevolence, security, committees) that can get us closer to our number of \$350,000, but there are challenging decisions to make, and we must do that together. I strongly encourage you to review the budget and come to the Annual Meeting with recommendations and questions.

If you have questions that you would like answered prior to the meeting, I encourage you to reach out to me or any member of Council. The Budget and Annual Report should be out by November 10.



For this I am forever grateful.



### Winter Adventures Small Group




