New Leaders Elected for the ELCA

While my family and I were enjoying a cool, relaxing week in the far northwest corner of the Lower 48, many friends and colleagues were gathered in blazing hot Phoenix, Arizona, for the ELCA's triennial Churchwide Assembly.

Perhaps most importantly, the assembly was considering candidates for the two most prominent positions at the head of the ELCA, The presiding bishop is a lot like our synod bishop, juggling the roles of both CEO and spiritual leader, while the secretary is responsible for, among other things, interpreting the ELCA's governing documents, which is way more important than it sounds.

For the first time, we have elected an African American pastor to each role, a first for either office. The Rev. Yehiel Curry, our new presiding bishop, has most recently been the bishop of the Metro Chicago Synod, and the ELCA's new secretary, the Rev. Lucille "CeeCee" Mills, has most recently been an assistant to the bishop of North Carolina Synod. Though prominent leaders in those synods, compared to previous occupants of those offices, they totally qualify as relative "outsiders."

I have not met Pr. Curry, but friends and colleagues who have worked with him are absolutely ecstatic and believe he is the right person for this moment. I met Pr. Mills, when we were both very new pastors in the Virginia Synod, and you could tell then that she was going to continue to overcome obstacles to "go places."

What interests me less than either leader's blackness—although that is an unapologetically a deep part of them both—is that they came to the pastorate by a process specifically intended for second-career candidates with lots of experience outside the church.

They also both, like me, have been what the ELCA calls "mission developers"—or what most people would call "church planters." It should go without saying that both have shown themselves to be worthy of that calling.

The ELCA is a big, lumbering beast, and it's already a shadow of the institution it was when formed in 1987. Its newest leaders have certainly already experienced how it steers more like a giant cargo ship in a narrow shipping lane than a nimble jet boat on the Rogue River!

But my prayer is that these two newly-elevated leaders, relative outsiders and very different from those who've previously occupied those roles, will be empowered by the Holy Spirit to lead us in fresh new directions and to rise to meet new challenges over the next six years that we can't quite yet imagine.

Interested in Acolyting?




