We are in a season of staff transitions—three, actually. One is very much in progress, as Janine Nave will soon step down as our financial accountant, to be replaced by Diana Little, who joined Calvary with our last round of new members. Longtime choir director, and more recently, music director Wendy Ross has announced her intention to retire at the end of the summer. And Kim White made good on her long-standing commitment to move on to make way for a new office administrator.

Diana comes to us most recently from Roseburg, where she was parish admin for Faith Lutheran, but she spent most of her life in the Sacramento area, where she worked in financial affairs for the USAF at McClellan Air Base. She is so eager to begin that she acquired a copy of QuickBooks to start learning it for herself, even before we brought her on board.

The Worship and Music committee is meeting imminently to discuss the music director transition. We are grateful for Wendy's many years of service as director of choirs, most recently under Nancy Hodgson, as well as stepping up to take on many of Nancy's duties upon her retirement. She is working ahead these days to plan worship music well in advance, and she will remain at Calvary as a resource to our next music director upon her formal retirement.

We are currently accepting applications for a new office administrator. Kim brought us through a particularly difficult period, as she started during my second month here, when I knew almost nothing about Calvary's office procedures. This gave her the opportunity to rework nearly everything she touched, streamlining and improving the workflow.

I am personally grateful for Kim's teamoriented mentality, and I am proud of Calvary for helping her get out of a difficult and potentially dangerous personal situation shortly after her hiring. Her departure has been well-timed for me to tackle our worship projection software, to make things happen that we knew were possible but had not yet been tried.

The reality of church work is an overlapping of the personal and the professional. The lines between workplace, family and source of spiritual connection and consolation, between working, leading and serving, and between work, play and rest, inevitably get blurry even for those with the clearest and best-protected boundaries. I will be doing my best as we bring on new staff to help them navigate these challenges, while they help Calvary continue to become the best version of itself, and I ask God to help and guide us.

REFLECTIONS FROM SISTER JENNIE

Trying New Things

When I first arrived at Calvary and began working with the Parish Education Team, we did some hard looking at the resources that we used to teach Sunday school and the devotions that were being offered to all ages. We've since started a new Sunday school curriculum that is great for PreK through middle school. We've also added family devotional newsletters to support our youngest families with newly baptized babies.

We also wanted to assess who was actually finding benefit from different devotional resources. We did surveys and also watched who was taking devotions weekly/monthly. We found that Christ in Our Home is still a very popular resource and so we will continue to provide it. We did find that there was a very minimal draw to another subscription resource called Taking Faith Home. We had been printing it out and also providing a digital copy of it weekly by email.

Just because we've been using something for a while doesn't mean that changing things up cannot be a good thing. So, the Parish Ed Team did some talking with those few who were using Taking Faith Home, listened to what it was that they appreciated so much about that resource, and also did some research to find an alternative possible resource that may cost less or even not cost at all. We think we found something, and we'd like to offer this new resource for you to try out in your own devotion faith life at home for a while, for those who are interested, and see what you think. Sometimes a new perspective on the same text from different writers can be exactly what you are needing. Something to break us out of the usual mold and make you think.

This new resource is called Faith Formation Journeys, written by a team of ELCA congregational leaders. It's a simple one page sheet. It provides this week's texts and offers a daily reflection question diving deeper into one or two passages from within the whole Gospel reading. It also gives a preview of what the next week's readings will be if you like to be prepared for the next Sunday morning.

Our plan is to add a PDF version in the Weekly Updates email that you receive on Fridays. We will do that for a while, but to not send it by email indefinitely. Be looking out for this to be added to the weekly email very soon. Eventually we'd like to equip you to receive it in your own email box directly from the writers as it arrives weekly if you find it to be beneficial to you. Please come talk to Sister Jennie if you find you enjoy this resource and would like to get it in your email box and

aren't sure how. You can also come talk to anyone on the Parish Education Team to let us know what you do or don't like about it. We will also print a few for Sunday mornings for a while. Just consider this an experiment—a chance to try something new!


