#### Social Benefits of Community

I'm rather reluctant to promote the "benefits" of being a Christian, especially ancillary ones. As Lutheran martyr and theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer wrote: "When Christ calls a man, he bids him come and die." The Gospel transforms us from selfishness and self-involvement for the sake of others. We don't embrace it because it's good for us, but rather because it's good for others.

And yet... one on-going and emerging tragedy of modern, Western life is that many people are becoming ever more isolated from one another. According to the Center for Disease Control in 2020, "social isolation significantly increases a person's risk of premature death from all causes." The overall risk of social isolation has surely only increased since.

Increasingly people, especially older folks, are living alone, and rates of volunteerism are dropping. Technology now allows some of us to work remotely and all of us to stay connected electronically, though perhaps superficially, but it can also isolate us from one another if, for example, we sit around together in a room with our noses in our phones.

Of course, loneliness and isolation are not the same thing: one can be extremely lonely in a crowded room. And yet the two clearly go hand-in -hand and seem to be increasing, and one of the biggest factors appears to be the swift decline in reported religious affiliation. It's no wonder: one well-reported finding is that people who were randomly assigned to sing in a choir reported less loneliness and more interest in life than those in a control group. Just being around other people is good for you. One of the best things about every congregation I have served has been the way that members check in on each other, especially informally. Sister Jennie and I spend a good bit of each week checking in on folks, but we're only two people. When a congregation makes this part of its collective and self-chosen work, the dividends are incalculable. People who otherwise might withdraw come out of their shells. Prayer needs that might go unidentified are brought to light. People who need assistance are less reluctant to ask for help.

And best of all, unlikely friendships form. If you look at Jesus' first disciples, it was a pretty unlikely and motley crew. Other than the first four, two pairs of fishermen who already knew each other, these people would have never come together without him.

That's maybe the best thing of all about church: Jesus brings people together, to care about and care for one another. And so it turns out that what's good for others becomes good for us, too. Maybe this benefit of Christian community isn't so ancillary after all!

## **REFLECTIONS FROM SISTER JENNIE**


## Connectedness

A fun activity I like to share with both youth and adults involves standing in a big circle with a large ball of string. One person starts by tossing the ball of string to someone across the circle, while holding onto the end of the string. The next person tosses the ball to someone else while still holding on to the string they received. One version has each person answer a question about themselves to help everyone around the circle get to know each other better. By the end it's easy to see a giant web of connectedness that has been created with nothing more than a ball of string.

This is a great image for any group. You can't always see the string, but it's there. When someone pulls on their string, it affects not only them but also a whole bunch of other people. If someone were to cut their section of string off from the rest of the web, that would affect everyone, too! We have shared memories and experiences, shared joy, shared sadness, shared worries, and so many other things, and this all affects the community in beautiful ways. Calvary has so much connectedness–deep friendships, so close they feel like familymultiple generations of individual families that come to Calvary, and so many other ways.

In Christ we are all connected, as it is the love of Christ that binds us together strongly in the good times and the challenging times. This is the image of the Body of Christ: many members and one body all connected in Christ. May we continue to find new connections with the familiar faces we see all the time, but also with the new faces that join into the life at Calvary, so that they, too, will feel the love and the connectedness of this community. We can do this by inviting them into what we know and love about Calvary. But as relationships are always two-way, we should also be open to listening to what new ideas they may be excited to share and try out with others at Calvary. Let us keep finding ways to celebrate our connectedness and fellowship in Christ with each other!


