HAPPY EASTER!

It is an exciting month for Calvary Lutheran Church. Besides celebrating Easter, we have the congregational meeting the week following to vote on a new pastoral team!

Did you ever wonder why the date for Easter changes every year? It would certainly be easier if it was the same date yearly. But Easter, like Passover, is scheduled based on the lunar calendar although the holidays are calculated differently. The lunar calendar is just over 29 days so every once in a while an extra month needs to be added to ensure the seasons line up.

The Jewish calendar is a lunar calendar and Passover always lands on the same day on the that calendar: the 14th of the month of Nisan. This is the first month of the religious year and the start of spring (Passover is also referred to as chag he-aviv, or the festival of spring). It's celebrated for seven days in Israel and by Reform Jews, and for eight days in Orthodox and Conservative Jews in the diaspora (everywhere else besides Israel). Passover starts this year on April 5.

Easter is intended to be connected to Passover because the first Holy Week that included Palm Sunday, the Last Supper, Good Friday and the Resurrection occurred during Passover. It would be so simple if we just followed the Jewish calendar but why make things simple? Easter always occurs on the first Sunday after the first full moon after the Spring Equinox. Got it?

Actually, it is simple if you remember that the Spring Equinox is the date in March when day and night are equal lengths and that occurs on either March 19th or 20th. Then you look for the next full moon. Then you look for the Sunday following the full moon and plan your Easter dinner accordingly. This year it is April 9.

Now you know. There will be a test.
