Janine and I read Father Richard Rohr's meditation daily at our breakfast table. I think if I weren't a Lutheran, I would be a Franciscan. The Franciscans are an order based on the life of Saint Francis. Here is a quote from their website about their founder: "Francis's love of Jesus inspired him to public preaching, and to take on the concerns of others. He reached out to the leper, the poor, and the marginalized, recognizing Christ's presence in them. He proclaimed God's love and peace, actively fostering reconciliation between warring parties. In all of creation, he perceived God's love and beauty." I see many touch points between our Lutheran understanding of grace as the heart our life with God and the Franciscans who see Christ's presence in all peoples as well as in all of creation. You are likely aware of the Prayer of St. Francis. When prayed it pulls us out of ourselves into the

concern and care for others. It is worth memorizing:

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace,

Where there is hatred, let me sow love; Where there is injury, pardon;

Where there is doubt, faith;

Where there is despair, hope;

Where there is darkness, light;

Where there is sadness, joy.

O Divine Master,

Grant that I may not so much seek

To be consoled as to console;

To be understood as to understand:

To be loved as to love.

For it is in giving that we receive;

It is in pardoning that we are pardoned;

And it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.

I found a Franciscan blessing that I would like to leave with you this August. It has the same goal of pulling us out of ourselves and calls us to action:


May God bless you with **discomfort** at easy answers, half-truths, and superficial relationships, so that you may live deep within your heart.

May God bless you with **anger** at injustice, oppression, and exploitation of people, so that you may work for justice, freedom, and peace.

And may God bless you with enough **foolishness** to believe that you can make a difference in this world, so that you can do what others claim cannot be done, to bring justice and kindness to all our children and the poor.



Waiting On God

Everyone I have spoken with at Calvary agrees that our process of calling the next Pastor must be a Holy Spirit led process. But many of us have grown impatient with an eight-month wait for a new Pastor.

It is usual for a congregation to become anxious during a Pastoral vacancy when there are not immediate resolutions.

"Why is it taking so long?"

"What happens if our interims leave us?"

"If there aren't a lot of candidates, will we ever get a new Pastor?"

"I'm afraid things will fall apart without the Pastor in place."

These are <u>our</u> anxieties and anxious people are inclined to jump to seemingly easy fixes. But easy, simple solutions to complex, frustrating situations are rarely the best decisions.

Here is a biblical example of what happens when we think we should 'help' God in a decision; when we feel compelled to go for the easy solution because we are not controlling the outcome.

Exodus 32 – The Golden Calf

God led the Hebrews out of slavery. He called Moses up Mt. Sinai to teach him how to form a nation.

But it was taking too long . . . according to the congregation.

The Hebrews got nervous. Things weren't working the way they wanted. So gave up waiting for God. They made a new god and figured it was the best, easy, fast solution.

Their failure to wait for God DOUBLED the time it took for them to enter the promised land.

Here are a few Biblical examples of believers who had long waits until God fulfilled a promise.

Abraham was 100 years old before God's promise of an heir was fulfilled.

Year after year Hannah went to the temple and begged God for a child. She got her child . . . in God's time. And Israel got one of their best Judges, Samuel. God had a plan that took time to fulfill.

Psalm 46 tells us:

God is our refuge and strength,

an ever-present help in trouble.

Therefore we will not fear . . .

And,

Be still, and know that I am God . . .

God has not abandoned us. Neither has the Bishop's office. Things are developing . . . just not as fast as we want

Be still and wait for the Lord to act. Overcome fear of our vacancy with faith that God has our Pastor in God's mind . . . who will come to us in *GOD'S* time. That God is in control, even if we wish God (and the Bishop) would act faster.
