

PROPERTY MANAGEMENT

The responsibility of the Property Management Committee is to care for the church property, to make repairs when needed and make recommendations for needed improvements.

In order to do this, we have to put in time and effort. Sometimes when something breaks or needs fixing one or more of our members can repair it, however most times it requires that we hire it done. A good example was when we found that our water bill was triple what it should be. We checked the meter and discovered that it was continually running even though everything was shut down and nothing should have been flowing thru the meter. We dug up and replaced the old pipe that ran between the street and the church and replaced the "back-flow" valve. However, water continued to flow. It was finally determined that the "leak" was occurring in the water line that ran under the church to the "old" section where the kitchen and bathrooms were. We had to put in a new water line that went from the side of the church thru the ceiling and down the side of the nursery and then go under the building and drill thru the foundation and reconnect to the old water line that feed the kitchen and bathrooms. Thanks to proper budgeting in the past for emergency repairs we were able to pay the cost and keep up with our regular bills.

I am sure that in the past much of the upkeep of the church was done by volunteers, such as lawn service and janitorial services. However, today we contract for most of these services. It is the committee's job to ensure that those are performed well, and we do that thanks to the generous giving by of our congregation. Unfortunately, these costs continue to go up as well and we need to be ever watchful of our members dollars.

Memories of Calvary Lutheran Church

What is a Lutheran "Sister?"

You may be asking yourself: "How is our new Director of Discipleship a 'Sister?" Or "I've never heard of a deaconess." "What's the difference between a deacon and a deaconess?" "How can you be a Lutheran sister? --sounds pretty Roman Catholic to me!" These are all great musings!

Did you know you already have two other deaconesses serving here in the Oregon Synod? They are called to very different kinds of ministry. Sister Cora is in Brookings serving and using her law degree to advocate for the homeless population in her area. Sister India is serving in Beaverton doing congregational ministry much like what my ministry at Calvary will be focused on. There are still more sisters in the neighboring California and Washington synods.

Traditionally Lutherans have been skeptical of monastic life, but this form of intentional community was revived in the early 1800s in Kaiserswerth, Germany. Early deaconesses studied together to become nurses and teachers. In 1884 John Lankenau invited seven sisters from Kaiserswerth to come to America. They helped found one of the largest hospitals in Philadelphia to this day, Lankenau Hospital. There are also hospitals in Omaha, Minneapolis, New York and elsewhere, all started by Lutheran deaconesses.

We are a community of Lutheran women who have been called to serve God professionally in the church and in the world in many varying ways. We live all over the US and Canada. Historically Deaconesses lived together in community in Motherhouses, including houses in Omaha, Baltimore, and Philadelphia, until 2001 when we sold the last Motherhouse in Philadelphia and moved our administrative operations to the ELCA's Lutheran Center in Chicago.

Today deaconess sisters are spread throughout the continent serving in very different settings--parish ministry of various types, nurse practitioners in doctors' offices and hospitals, schoolteachers, chaplains, assistants to synod bishops, social workers and more. Sister Cora and Sister India are perfect examples of the very distinct types of ministries deaconesses serve in. A deaconess used to dress in garb very similar to a stereotypical Roman Catholic nun--but in more recent decades, you might say, we got out of the habit! You can find us wearing attire appropriate to our work. But all deaconesses wear a cross-shaped pin with 2 Corinthians 5:14 inscribed on the cross, for we are "compelled by the love of Christ."

The ELCA has long struggled with the place, shape and language around its Diaconate (formerly known as deaconesses, diaconal ministers and associates in ministry) on both theological and practical levels. So in 2016 the ELCA voted to simplify our language and create two ways to serve professionally: Ministers of Word and Sacrament with the title of "pastor" and Ministers of Word and Service with the title of "deacon"--unless one already had a title, as deaconesses did. Then in 2019 the ELCA voted that all deacons would join pastors in being ordained. So, I am an ordained ELCA deacon, but as my identity has long been as a sister of the Deaconess Community since 2008, I continue to introduce myself as "Sister Jennie."

I am excited to be returning to the state of Oregon, as I was born and baptized in Milwaukie in 1981. We moved away when I was just one year old, and then we returned to another suburb of Portland, Lake Oswego, for my 1st - 3rd grade school years, after which we moved East for good. I am so glad that God has carved a path to bring me back and to be able to explore a very different part of Oregon.

I would love to tell you more about sisters and deaconesses, so please feel free to ask questions as we get to know each other. As your new Director of Discipleship, I am excited to get to know each of you and what you love about Calvary. I look forward to jumping into the ministry already happening at Calvary, while also doing much listening and learning to see where I will have the most beneficial and meaningful impact for the life of Calvary and its mission to share the Good News of Jesus Christ in this part of Oregon.

PARISH ED

June marks the time of sunshine and fun and rest for the Parish Ed staff. We had a great year and would like to share highlights of last year and our goals for the 2023/2024 Sunday School year.

As a group we agreed upon four goals, 1) connecting children and volunteers through engaging activities that allowed for interaction and living faith, 2) aligning the Bible lesson to the liturgical calendar that we follow each week at Calvary, 3) clean and update the the Sunday School meeting areas and supplies for the kids of all ages, 4) provide multi-generational opportunities with the whole church body and the Sunday School kids.

With prayers, a little ingenuity and lots of smiles the Parish Ed committee made the best of limited resources. Despite limited volunteers, a wide breadth of age groups and no curriculum the 22/23 Sunday School year was a success. Our flexible schedule helped us navigate the year and began the essential work of building relationships with our Calvary kids.

Lots of things worked. The schedule took the pressure off the limited staff with a whole group outing and meeting. The recent hiring of a Nursery Staff Attendant means the nursery is open once again and there is the opportunity to provide the pre-school group Bible-based curriculum separate from the elementary group, a win-win for each class. We made strides in updating the nursery and the Sunday School areas are clean and organized. Finally, this year we had two events that were multi-generational where all of us could have fun and fellowship as a whole church. As a team we have hopes and dreams for this next year and share them with you below. We ask you to partner with us in prayer as we look forward to the fast-approaching start date of Sunday School on Sunday, September 17.

- 1. Hiring Hope as the Nursery Attendant is a blessing, but unfortunately she is unable to cover every Sunday due to her college commitment. We are looking for eligible candidates to apply for the position of Nursery Attendant for the full year and Holy Holidays. The pay is \$18hr/hour. Candidates must be 16 years or older. Mothers with small children may also apply. Please get the word out! Ideally, 2-3 Nursery Attendants would allow for coverage and subs to cover the year. All interested parties should send their interest to calvarylutheranparished@gmail.com.
- 2. We are in need of a curriculum with ready resources so that multiple teachers can step in and teach a class at their level of interest.
- 3. Over the summer, work will continue in the nursery to repair the sound system (so mom's can hear the service) and to patch/paint a wall that needs attention after previous work. There are plans to purchase supplies for both the youth room and nursery this summer and fall.
- **4.** We are looking for more volunteers to teach Sunday School. Please pray about this. Additional volunteers allow teachers to spread the workload throughout the year and increase the impact we can have on students as more adults share their living faith with our Calvary kids and youth.
- **5.** We are praying that the Calvary kids and youth will enjoy many multi-generational opportunities as we as a congregation look to the future of Calvary.

Mark your calendars for Sunday, September 17th for our multigenerational Sunday School Kick-Off Pizza and Ice Cream Party. We hope to see everyone there for food, games, and fellowship to mark the beginning of the 23/24 Sunday School Year.

As the Parish Ed Committee, we look forward to an exciting year. We are growing with our four newest Sunday School Meyer kiddos and hope that this is the beginning of a trend of expanding our program! We look forward to partnering with our new Pastor team and with you as we ask God to give us wisdom, discernment, and love in action for the kids and youth that God has and will entrust us with at Calvary Lutheran Church..
