Sometimes in life, when decisions have to be made, and we are unsure of the direction we should turn, it can be a bit stressful and we can feel very uncertain. In these times, it's easy to feel anxious and uneasy. However, its precisely during these times that God tells us to turn to Him, to trust Him. But this is when it's most difficult.

Over the past year and a half our church has felt a fair amount of uncertainty. I've heard questions raised such as; *Who will our next pastor be? Who is going to take care of this job or that job? Our congregation is getting older, how can we attract younger members? What are our long-range goals?* My goal as president has been to have a strong, successful pastoral interim team in place. This team will care for, maintain and strengthen the ministries within our congregation, and will provide a solid, healthy church body for the incoming pastor to take over and lead. Throughout this process, prayer to God and trusting in Him has been pivotal. In fact, I was just reading this morning from the book of 2 Chronicles 26:5, where it states, *"Uzziah sought God during the days of Zechariah, who taught him to fear God. And as long as the king sought guidance from the Lord, God gave him success."* Seeking this guidance is dire.

Last month, when Scott presented the official recommendation from the Call Committee to call this pastoral team, I felt hope and excitement. At our Council meeting on Feb. 9, the Council unanimously voted to accept this recommendation and bring this pastoral team to the congregation for a vote. Before this vote occurs at a special congregational meeting on April 16, everyone will have a couple of opportunities to meet the prospective pastoral team and their family. The family will be arriving in Grants Pass on Friday, March 17 and we are planning an afternoon event on Saturday, March 18, as well as a brunch and social time after worship service on March 19. I hope that everyone marks those dates on their calendar and will take this opportunity to get to know this family.

I believe with all my heart that God has been walking with our church family over the last year and a half. He has been providing for our church, strengthening us, and guiding us so that we are ready to receive the gifts He has in store for us. I encourage all of us to continue praying for guidance and to continue trusting that God will provide for all of our needs.



World Mission Prayer League – Schroeder Family For the past 9 years, Calvary has supported the Schroeder Family's missionary work in the Philippines. Last summer, the church council voted to stop our monthly benevolence to them effective December 31, 2022. To gather more information regarding their fund-raising opportunities, the World Mission Prayer League (WMPL) was contacted to inquire when the Schroeder's current contract would be ending and when they would be returning to the US to begin visiting congregations. These visits allow the Schroeders to thank supporting congregations and to help them raise funding for their work in the Philippines. WMPL stated that the Schroeders will be returning to the US in 2024. In December, the council voted to continue to support the Schroeders through 2023 so that they will have ample time during next year's visits to find additional/alternative funding for their work while they are visiting the US



Smarter Giving That Benefits You and Calvary



What are the benefits of providing a gift directly from your IRA?

- It is a simple way to make a lasting impact at Calvary
- The gift counts toward your required minimum distribution
- The gift is excluded from your gross income. It will be reported to the IRS as a QCD—qualified charitable distribution.

What are the simple rules and requirements?

- You must be 70 ½ or older at the time of the gift
- To ensure that your IRA transfer is not taxable, the check must be made payable to *Calvary Lutheran Church*, not to you personally. Provide your investment firm with Calvary's name and address so they can mail the check directly to the church
- The gift must not exceed \$100,000
- Let Calvary's treasurer know you are intending to make an IRA rollover distribution.

Call Committee

Your Call Committee has been busy over the last month. We are continuing to move forward with the current candidate. He will be coming out for another visit March 17th through March 21st with his whole family. Only key people in his current congregation know about his potential call. He will not be notifying his current congregation until we have extended an official call to him. Between now and then he will be praying for discernment about a call with Calvary Lutheran in Grants Pass. To be respectful of that process we will not be releasing his name to the wider Calvary congregational family until his next visit in March. Please allow him the opportunity to be the one to share with his congregation in his time about this call.

When the Bishop presented this candidate to the Call Committee, she indicated that this was a unique opportunity for us to hire a husband-and-wife ministry team. He would fill the role as Pastor and she would be available on a part-time basis to support Calvary in ministries that she has been trained for and performed over the years. The Call Committee was very excited to talk with both candidates the Holy Spirit had led to our church. Although we have only met, in-person, the candidate for pastor during his visit with us in January, we have had a remote Zoom interview and conversations with his wife. The Call Committee was unanimous in our vote to recommend both candidates to Council to Call for our vacant Pastoral position.

Last month we brought this same candidate out for several days at the end of January. Your Call Committee and select Council members were able to spend some quality time talking with him about Calvary and what the area has to offer him, his wife and 4 children. He was especially interested in learning more about the school systems in Grants Pass as his children range in age from 4 years to 10 years old. He also got a little bit of sticker shock when looking at housing in the area. It is quite a bit more expensive here than where he is currently living. Since he and his wife are coming as a team part of the discussions centered around a salary package that would allow both to work in ministry here at Calvary. He is rostered with the ELCA as a Minister of Word and Sacrament, has his Master of Divinity from Princeton Theological Seminary and completed his Lutheran Year at Lutheran Theological Seminary. He has 12 years of experience including his current role as the Pastor at his current church, working as a Pastor/Mission Developer, a Coordinator of Youth and Family Ministry and a Director of a Youth Development Center.

A little about his wife. She is rostered with the ELCA as Minister of Word and Service, has a Master of Arts in Youth and Family Ministry from Luther Northwestern Theological Seminary and a Bachelor of Arts from Ohio State University. She is active in the ELCA Deaconess Community and has helped plan multiple Deaconess Assemblies. She is currently working as Director of Discipleship at her current church. Her prior work experience included Parish Deaconess & Co-Mission Developer/Redeveloper, Family Ministry Coordinator, Parish Administrator, Director of Youth & Family Ministry.

In summary, the Call Committee was unanimous in recommending that both individuals be called to Calvary. This recommendation was presented at the Feb 9th Council meeting where they voted and approved the Call Committee recommendations. The Call Committee is coordinating another visit with this candidate and his family so that the entire Calvary family can meet them prior to the final Congregational meeting on April 16th. This Congregational meeting is where all voting members have the opportunity to vote on who our next pastor will be. I strongly encourage everyone to take the time to meet these candidates during their March visit so that you can see who the Holy Spirt has led to our church and if after prayerful discernment, they will be called to Calvary.
