



"Thanksgiving Every Day"

We recently introduced a new song one of my favorites from way back called "Messiah" by Larry Olson. I've been enjoying the music of Olson and his "Dakota Road" bandmates ever since they wrote and sang the theme song for the 1994 ELCA Youth Gathering in Atlanta, which I attended as a high schooler.

He's one of the reasons I now play the guitar, and I have a whole collection of songs written by him and the rest of the Dakota Road crew. One song in particular always comes to mind every November for me, "Everyday is Thanksgiving." Its simple chorus:

Everyday is Thanksgiving Everyday is worth living because I know you care Everyday is Thanksgiving when I remember that you love me

The short verses confess what stops us from expressing that gratitude confidently, constantly and generously: mostly fear and selfishness. But both verses end by describing how God's love breaks through and reminds us that actually, everything we have been entrusted with has been a gift from God in the first place. Or to put it in the language of Luther's Small Catechism, left to our own devices, we fear, love and trust the wrong things. Yet we are freed from our misplaced priorities by the Holy Spirit, and we are enabled to love others precisely because God first loved us, as shown to us in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

So, what if Thanksgiving were more than just one Thursday at the end of each November, the closest thing we have to a kickoff of the twin seasons of Advent and Christmas? What if we've actually been freed to live into that kind of gratitude and generosity every single day?

The song ends by putting a twist on the last line of the chorus:

Everyday is Thanksgiving When I remember that you love me When I remember who died for me



The group slows down or stops, along with that person, and says, "We're here for you." God is good!

But these are just two examples of small groups that people are trying out and that are available at Calvary. But it's not the only way to do small groups. A book study during the winter would be a great idea, and a good way to get to know each other through the shared experience of reading a book together.

People of Calvary, how would you like to get to know people better? Or what would you like to see happening at Calvary that might help your faith grow deeper? These are big thoughts to chew on. Feel free to come talk to me more if you're curious, you have an idea, or you just want to connect more with others but don't know how.






Hearts & Hands Greens Arrangement Class Coming Soon!


