#### **New Year's Devotions**

'Tis the season for forming good intentions, taking on new projects, creating new habits, and according to extensive research, reverting to previous habits within months, if not days, or weeks! The enduring appeal of New Year's Resolutions is testament to the triumph of human optimism over experience.

Perhaps you already have a regular devotional pattern or Bible reading plan that works for you. In that case, may it continue to meet you where you are headed in the new year!

But if you're anything like me, you've tried road. In the meantime, whatever you many plans and patterns over the years and struggled to find one that sticks. Calvary offers "Christ in Our Home" as a quarterly print offering, as well as sending "Taking Faith Home" and Calvary's own "Midweek your best laid plans and intentions fall Meditation" by email on a weekly basis. I gratefully commend all of these to you.

But perhaps these aren't what you need either. I'm happy to help you evaluate any devotional materials or Bible reading plans with you on a one-on-one basis to find something that suits your interests and desired, sustainable level of commitment.

Let me also offer the one resource that has been most helpful to me for over a decade now. The Moravian Daily Texts, in

continuous print for nearly 300 years, are distributed by a group started by a forerunner to Martin Luther himself, Jan Hus (aka John Huss). The Moravians' missionary zeal was renewed in the early 1700s by a young Lutheran, Count Nicholas Zinzendorf, who was perhaps a little too energetic for his fellow Lutherans in Saxony!

The Moravian Daily Texts can be found on their website <a href="https://www.moravian.org/">https://www.moravian.org/</a> daily texts/ or ordered in print, subscribed to by email, or now even browsed in a smartphone app. I receive them in my email daily. They offer a "watchword," two short snippets of scripture and a related prayer, and three or four longer Bible passages which, if you keep up with over the course of a year, will cover a huge proportion of the Old and New Testaments.

I offer this only because it's the one resource I keep coming back to! I'll tell you more about the Moravians down the resolve in the next week, may God grant you the grace and strength to see it through — or at least the daily hope of renewal and redirection to God's will in your life, when through. Again.

## InterGenerational Ministry: What Does This Mean?

Last month I wrote about "intergenerational ministry" and heard clearly that some of you have questions about what that even means. I always strive to speak and write as clearly as possible. If I ever say something that doesn't make sense or you don't understand, please come talk directly to me and we can chat. In this case, I already see inter-generational ministry happening at Calvary, and I would love to see even more develop over time!

Intergenerational ministry simply refers to any ministry or faith-building activity involving people of varying ages, including those with an age gap of at least 20 years. Several of our small groups and bible studies fit this definition, as do some of the events that Parish Ed has created with the hope of mixing people of various ages. We know that not everyone in the congregation will participate each time, and we want to offer a variety of different opportunities. The goals are always the same: building faith and building relationships.

It often makes sense to create gatherings or groups that are age-specific. But other times, we can create opportunities for younger people to learn about faith and build relationships with those older than them, and vice-versa. It's amazing what each of us can learn from kids and youth, even with our years of experience.

Worship is the most central expression of ministry at Calvary, and we are all worshiping together. That is the heart of intergenerational ministry, although we don't normally call it that. As I've said before, and will surely say again, kids and youth are still learning how and why we worship in the particular ways that we do. And we learn from each other by being and doing things together. Simply put, being at church is more fun when we're doing it all together, older and younger alike!
