


Happy Valentine's... Ashes?

Every once in a while, our various calendars and traditions manage to line up in a truly spectacularly ironic way. Not only is 2024 a leap year. Not only will 2024 see the season of Lent fall almost as early as it possibly can. This year Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, falls on the Feast of Saint Valentinus—or as it's more commonly known, Valentine's Day.

Ironies abound! Like nearly all official saints, Valentine's feast day marks the occasion of the 3rd century bishop's death—according to at least one account, by beheading. How romantic!

The association of Valentine's Day with romance, flowers, chocolate and so forth seems to come from a medieval association with courtly love, and that connection seems to have more to do with the time of year—the first signs of winter's thaw—than anything specifically to do with Valentine's life or death, in any of the various overlapping and conflicting traditions.

So this year we mark the first day of Lent, during which many choose to "give something up"—say, chocolate?—

with a day now somehow associated with giving chocolates. And we'll gather to be reminded of our mortality on the death day of the one saint besides jolly ol' Saint Nick to have his feast turned into a widely celebrated secular occasion.

This is a good year, then, to remember that the love at the heart of the story we share is not some impossible romantic ideal, but the universal, sacrificial love of God revealed in Christ Jesus. Talk about suffering for love's sake! And the one passion that matters most is the occasion that waits for us at the end of Lent: the Passion of Jesus Christ, the one crucified for my sake and yours. Happy Ash-Valentine's Day!



#### Dear Calvary,

I wanted to thank you for your generous support of Angel Tree. As a congregation, we were able to provide 115 foster kids in Josephine County with Christmas presents. We also prepared and provided 150 surprise bags for children visiting Santa at the Christmas party. To support the Christmas party, we also provided 12 dozen cookies for decorating and eating. Thank you for your generosity in all those areas.

Our next project will be *Welcome Boxes*. When children are taken into custody, they often have to wait several hours for placement. A social worker gives them age-appropriate boxes to occupy their time. They will then take these boxes with them into their new foster home. They are given these boxes to provide some comfort and entertainment. It is a scary time for them.

What to include in Welcome Boxes: Age groups: 2-4, 5-9, 10-12, 13-17, boy or girl.

Essentials: Something to color or write with, something to color or write on, toothpaste, flashlight (with batteries), nightlight, encouraging note (You are special, You matter, Made for you with love).

Fill the rest of the box with age-appropriate items, such as, books, toys, Legos, socks, dolls, cars, etc. No religious items, vitamins, hygiene items containing alcohol, violent play, or used items. Put in a plastic bag and mark the bag with age and gender and place in the Every Child box in the narthex.



#### **Thinking About Loss**

Janine and I have a friend whose husband died two years ago. She is a strong, intelligent woman who is working, is very socially active and seems to be always travelling somewhere. She is living a very full life; vet, she has told us about how lonely and painful it is to be without her husband. The nights are the loneliest. I have come to realize that grief is not something to "get over," or even, "move on from." The loss of someone that we love will always be there. At first, that loss is all we can focus on. But eventually we build our lives around it. We can be active, productive, and even joyful—but that loss never goes away. Even many years later, we will revisit it. When we do, we might experience pain, loneliness, even guilt. But we will also find thanksgiving and, as Christians, the hope of reconnecting with that loved

Sitting in every pew of our congregation are people who have experienced loss. For some of us, the loss has been very recent, and that wound is very tender. For others of us, it has been a while, but we still remember. With that awareness, Sister Jennie, Pastor Jon, and I wonder if some of us would find a support group helpful. This would be a safe place to share with others who are also grieving a loss. I would facilitate this group; however, the structure and frequency of this group has yet to be determined. If you might be interested in engaging in this process with me, please let me know.

Such a group could be a way we can activate what Paul writes in 1Co. 1.4. To paraphrase, "God comforts us in all our sorrows so that we can comfort others in their sorrows with the consolation we ourselves have received from God."


