Just a Bit Out of Sync

We're entering what many people call the "most wonderful time of the year"-decorations, shopping, feasting, visiting friends and family, gifting, re-gifting, and huddling up around warmth wherever we can find it. Meanwhile, the traditional church calendar is hitting the reset button and stubbornly insisting that no matter what's going on "out there," Christmas is still almost a month away, and when it arrives it'll be twelve days long through Epiphany, just like the famous song with the partridge in a pear tree.

There's a part of me that, by training, by upbringing, and by my own contrary nature, wants to insist, "Hey! Christmas isn't here yet! It's Advent! Be patient!" And yet so many of us have spent the last few years, quite understandably, avoiding places with lots of people that a different part of me wants to say, "Let's get out and celebrate any way we can!" And for those who can't get out, let's find ways to bring the celebration to them.

Around this time last year, I learned that as much as some people get annoyed by others decorating for Christmas in November, we've got nothing on the Philippines, where Christmas celebrations are already underway every September, and last until several weeks into January. That's right: the whole county spends over a third of the year in "Christmas mode." You can

look it up – "Christmas in the Philippines" has its own Wikipedia article!

It turns out that celebrating something for longer doesn't actually make it less special, and Filipinos find plenty of spare capacity for other celebrations during their long Christmas season. Sometimes a word of hope and a word of joy is exactly what we need, especially for folks who can't get out like they used to. So we'll spend the next few weeks celebrating both Advent and the approach of Christmas together. It's not like we're going to sing most of those traditional Advent carols once Christmas is here!

Christmas is indeed coming, and it's worth celebrating that, as well as the promise that Christ came not just once two thousand years ago as a baby in a small town ninety miles west of the Jordan River, but also promises to come again in a majesty and mystery that we cannot quite imagine. And we are also promised in the meantime that Christ enters our hearts whenever and wherever we share a gift, a smile, a hot mug, or a song with others. May you and yours have a blessed Advent and indeed a Merry Christmas!

How do you walk with someone who is having a Blue Christmas? Do you need to have the right words? Do we need to pretend to not have Christmas joy when we're around someone who is struggling? Should you feel guilty being joyful when you know they're in pain?

#### A few suggestions

-Friends, listen to the hurt...just listen -There are probably no right words...sometimes silence says what needs to be said -Be present...be available so they know they're not alone

-Ask them what they need and want...give their voice of control power

-Show them love...Christmas is about love -Together find a new meaning to this time of the year...create new meaningful rituals -Do the things that brings your heart Christmas joy...your joy might bring them new joy



This December, may you have the wonder and anticipation of Advent, but also fulfill the excitement that allows cookies, carols, wrapping presents, and decorations to bring you Christmas joy. And may you be more attuned to those who you know who are suffering from grief and mourning, those who find a different meaning or are still seeking any meaning at this time of the year. Let us all find ways to walk together in Christian community listening and waiting for the hope of the season yet to come.




