

A Quick Look at Kairos Torch

Kairos Torch Evidenced based behavioral program provides a 2½ day Christ-centered experience. Kairos Torch is for youthful offenders, and is for those institutions classified as Youthful Offender Facilities, housing youths age 13-19. Kairos Torch is ecumenical in nature, striving for denominational balance among the team. Kairos Torch is financially self-supporting as are all Kairos programs. Team members are recruited from among those who have a heart for working with the youth and commitment to mentor weekly for 6 months . Team members come from church communities and their well-balanced lives will reflect their Christian values. Every team includes a clergy, who acts as spiritual leader. A Torch weekend is designed to minister to 18 to 30 participants, however has had 7 to 10 participants The Torch team is made up of 20 to 30 volunteers who volunteer inside the facility and as support team out side the facility, depending on the number of residents who attend.




Lutheran Disaster Relief

Fires, floods, tornados, and hurricanes continually sweep across the country. This year the council added Lutheran Disaster Relief to our benevolence budget to provide aid to the victims of these disasters. 4% of our general receipts collected each week and distributed quarterly. For the quarter ending March 31, \$2,661 was forwarded to the agency.
